For about a decade, Charles wrote and graded the commercial real estate specialization exam.

Charles was one of the pioneers of Continuing Legal Education in Texas. Charles has been everything a person can be in many courses and seminars. He's been a course chair, planning committee member, and faculty member at the Advanced Real Estate Law Course, the Advanced Real Estate Transactions Course, Advanced Real Estate Drafting Course, SMU Real Estate and Leasing Seminars, the UT Mortgage Lending Institute, Texas Wesleyan School of Law, and the University of Houston School of Law. He has presented papers at over forty institutes. His presentations have always been extremely well researched, very informative, and always presented with Charlie's wonderful humor and wit. Clearly, Charles is one of the leading reasons that Texas excels in continuing legal education for real estate practitioners.
